Canadian Shield

- Considered to be the geographic foundation of Canada.
- Formed during the Precambrian Era.
- Contains some of the world's oldest rocks (3.96 billion years old)
- Covers approximately 4,800,000 km² (half of Canada)
- Comprised of exposed bedrock and thin soils due to glaciers eroding and removing enormous amounts of soil, clay, rock, and gravel.





(1) Canadian Shield - Mining

- The Canadian Shield consists mainly of igneous and metamorphic rocks.
- Contains metallic minerals such as gold, nickel, copper, and lead.



- Referred to as Canada's "metallic mineral storehouse".
- Many towns rely on the mining industry for jobs
 - > Yellowknife → gold
 - ➤ Sudbury → nickel and copper








(2) Canadian Shield - Hydroelectric Power

 The Canadian Shield provides a great quantity of hydroelectric power from flowing rivers.
